The Axios - Loudias - Aliakmonas Delta National Park: a precious place

The Axios - Loudias - Aliakmonas National Park is amongst the most important wetland systems both in Greece and throughout Europe! Beginning just 10 kilometres south-west of the city of Thessaloniki, the park extends as far as Pieria, an area of 38,800 hectares. Within this area are to be found the estuaries of the Gallikos and Loudias rivers, the Kalohori lagoon, the deltas of the Axios and Aliakmonas rivers, the Nea Agathoupoli wetland and the salt marsh of Alyki Kitros.

This protected area is particularly precious as it hosts many plant, animal and bird species, some of which are rare and protected. At the same time, man enjoys its gifts in abundance: oxygen and water, agricultural and farm products, fish and mussels. A further priceless gift is on offer to visitors: tranquillity, getting in touch with nature, the chance to get up close to flamingos, great egrets, the wild horses of the Axios Delta and other marvellous creatures of the area.

The wetland in figures:

295 bird species, that is, 66% of all the species that have been observed to date in Greece, of which **103** are nesting

350 plant species and sub-species

34 mammal species

28 reptile and amphibian species

25 habitats, two of which are designated as 'priority' habitats at a European level
